Public Informational Meeting – March 7, 2017

Meeting Purpose

- Review of existing conditions and seek public input to help identify issue that could affect the roadway design
- Gather information from public regarding existing needs and concerns along the corridor
- Seek public input for improvements at the intersection of Casey Road and Almond Road

Project Study Limits



Project Purpose

- Review opportunities to improve Casey Road within the project limits
- Replace several crossroad culverts
- Evaluate strategies to reduce the frequency and severity of crashes at the Almond Road intersection
- Evaluate need for a paved shoulder to improve bicycle and pedestrian safety along the corridor.

Minimal shoulders and typical pavement failure



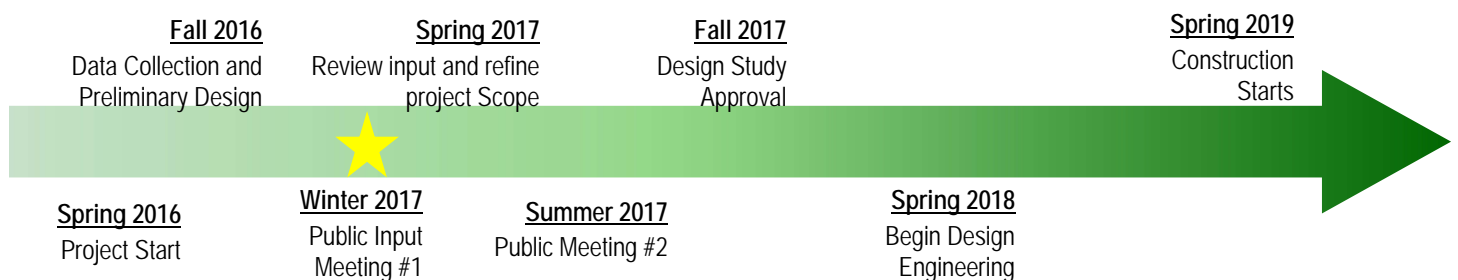
Existing Conditions

- Casey Road provides one travel lane in each direction
- Current travel lanes are approximately 11-feet wide with little to no paved shoulder provided
- Casey Road has a posted speed limit of 45-miles per hour
- Casey Road carries between 5,500 (east end) and 7,600 (west end) vehicles per day
- Almond Road is a "T" intersection under Stop Sign Control
- Open Space, Conservation Easements and Residential properties exist within the project limits

Funding Considerations

- Libertyville Township Highway Department requested and secured a commitment for federal Surface Transportation Program (STP) funding for improvements to Casey Road between US Rte. 45 and IL Rte. 21 through the Lake County Council of Mayors. Using this Federal Funding source requires more stringent design standards and an increased scope of improvements. The funds awarded by the Lake County Council will cover 80% of the project's construction costs. Phase I Engineering costs are 100% funded by the Road District. Phase II Engineering is eligible for an 80% cost share.
- Without the benefit of the STP Funds, Libertyville Township Highway Department would anticipate a traditional milling and resurfacing project with minimal changes to the existing roadway. All design and construction costs would be 100% funded by the Road District.
